Requirements:

Proof of Hepatitis B immunizations will be required before participating in blood draws in HPR 1020.
 Students will need to purchase black scrubs for the program.

This certificate is designed to prepare you for employment as a phlebotomist in the healthcare industry. The program includes hands-on skills training in phlebotomy, point-of-care testing, and lab processing and procedures. After successful completion of the program, you are eligible to apply and sit for the national AMT (American Medical Technologists) certification exam. <https://americanmedtech.org/>. The Internship is completed during the second half of the semester, following the 10-week accelerated Phlebotomy course.

All students must complete and pass a criminal background check and health/drug screen at their own cost, at least 60 days (about 2 months) before enrolling in an internship by using the current approved RRCC background check and drug screen program. Students must also provide proof of Current BLS for Professionals Certification, all required immunizations, submit a physician's approval/health form, and complete all required courses with a grade of C or better.
