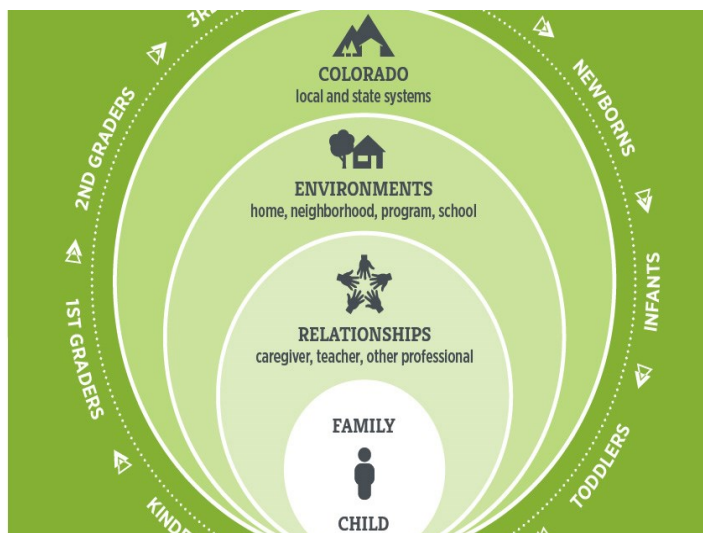

School Readiness

What does it take to fully prepare children for academic success? What does school readiness look like for early childhood programs serving infants, toddlers and families? Why does it matter? School readiness is, at once, a commonly understood and profoundly misunderstood term. This workshop will focus on the broader definitions of school readiness and present a more contemporary view of the subject as a powerful framework for improving equity in access to education and in learning outcomes, especially for marginalized children. Discussion will include the multiple contexts, dimensions and domains of school readiness and the research linking school readiness to learning, school completion, later skill development, acquisition of academic competencies and non-academic success.

BrainWise

At the core of every basic decision we all make is problem solving. What skill could be more useful and pervasive? Yet we often assume that children know how to problem solve and make decisions. How do we teach children to make decisions, quickly, easily, and creatively? Research has shown that problem solving/decision making skills are present in resilient children. By developing and fostering higher order, critical thinking skills children will have sound and intelligent ways to respond to choices and conflicts.

This interactive workshop will introduce participants to the “Ten Wise Ways” based on the BrainWise curriculum developed by Dr. Patricia Gorman Barry. The curriculum combines research from medicine, education and the social sciences creating a format that teaches children, teens, and adults how to develop problem solving/decision making skills. The “Ten Wise Ways” allow children to consider differences, options and possibilities, allow them to deal with the consequences of their decisions and enable them to become competent and confident individuals. The training will focus on the principles and concepts of cognitive and brain development to increase awareness, enhance and support the healthy growth and resilience of children.

Colorado's Competencies

Colorado released Colorado's Competencies for Early Childhood Teachers and Administrators to support teachers and administrators in their professional development. These competencies are now reflected on training certificates accepted for renewal of licensure.

What are the content areas of Colorado's Competencies for Early Childhood Teachers and Administrators?

Child Growth and Development, Child Observation and Assessment, Family and Community Partnerships, Guidance, Health, Safety and Nutrition, Professional Development and Leadership, Program Planning and Development, and Teaching Practice.

The competencies are broken into four levels:

Level 1: Demonstrates basic skills and knowledge to support quality early childhood care and education

Level 2: Demonstrates skills and knowledge from level 1 plus applies skills and knowledge to implement effective early childhood environments and experiences for young children.

Level 3: Demonstrates skills and knowledge of previous levels plus, designs, plans, and analyzes policies, procedures and practices that are optimal for young children.

Level 4: Demonstrates the skills and knowledge at previous levels plus: advances the field of early childhood education through advocacy.
