Meet MEC-C member, James Moholt!

Early Childhood Education News

Recently, I had the opportunity to interview James Moholt, ECE teacher with the Cherry Creek School District and member of Men In Early Childhood-Colorado (MEC-C).

Where do you currently work? I work for CCSD as a general education Pre-K teacher. I have a morning and afternoon class of 15 kids in each session. The classes are blended with a mix of tuition, SPED and CPP students. I have specialists who support the class and they come to the room once a week. Together we plan and implement SPED strategies for kids receiving service. My class has two TA's in the morning and one in the afternoon. Each class is 2.5 hours long. Children as young as 3 yrs. may attend as well as those attending Kindergarten next year.

How did you get started in ECE? I began volunteering at my children's preschool, Bethany Early Childcare Center, that morphed into being a substitute and later I accepted a teacher's position in 1998. During this time I was completing my MA in Psychology with an emphasis on school counseling. Throughout my school internship I discovered that school counselors do not counsel. They administrate and discipline. My kids were now older and did not need a stay-

at-home dad any longer. I responded to a job wanted ad for a TA in the elementary school. The director of Early Childhood called and asked if I would accept a position as a preschool teacher. I said yes. This was 2006. I love what I do while continually struggling with administrative fiats that are more in line with academic schooling. I believe that preschool is where children learn how to work with and appreciate other people. They have 12 years to learn the alphabet and I guarantee they will do so. My focus is

on the social and emotional skills they will need to succeed throughout their lives. Do you have personal hobbies you like to use in the classroom with the children? I love books and wood working and use both as tools in the classroom. I love boys who roughhouse and play lots of games that include physical challenges. I love the kids when they make connections of their own. I love watching them grow in skills and confidence. I love seeing them discover ways to get around "walls." I love seeing them come back years later and say they like school and they are good at it. I hate all the holes in my pants!

Do you have any advice for men considering entering the ECE profession? Early Childhood Education is all about nurturing the child. As a male, my concept of nurture is different from many of my colleagues. As the only male on staff at Cherry Creek, I am able to bring a perspective that is unique. I understand that boys communicate physically and need an outlet which allows this. My class is full of games that require group interactions with the academic skills embedded.

James, thank you for sharing a candid view of your work in the classroom and with young children!
