Our NAEYC self study process has revealed to Kathleen and I how we need to promote more learning opportunities for students to engage in about building positive parent relationships.

In my email, I have received an invitation to participate in a webinar about using social media (facebook, twitter, etc.) to create learning communities between teachers and parents of children in their classrooms.
