



Earn College Credit at Red Rocks

Concurrent Enrollment is a high school program that allows high school students in 9th-12th grade to take college classes for dual credit (high school and college credit). College courses can be offered on the college or high school campus. Under Concurrent Enrollment, the college tuition may be paid by your school district upon approval from the high school principal.

To get started, follow the steps below:

STEP 1: TALK TO YOUR HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELOR

- Upon approval from your high school, you may take course work at Red Rocks for dual credit (high school and college credit). Ask your counselor about Concurrent Enrollment or ASCENT programs.

STEP 2: FILL OUT THE PAPERWORK

- Complete the Concurrent Enrollment Agreement and Registration Sheet and provide your SASID number- your high school counselor can provide you with this district ID number.
- Read and sign the Student Payment Agreement with a parent.

STEP 3: FILL OUT THE APPLICATIONS

- Complete the free Red Rocks Community College Application for Admission and College Opportunity Fund Application online at: www.rrcc.edu- Click on "Apply Now".
 - o Be sure to say "YES" to the College Opportunity Fund.

STEP 4: COMPLETE RRCC ONLINE ORIENTATION AT: www.rrcc.edu/orientation

- Red Rocks 101 is a mandatory online orientation program designed to provide recently-admitted students (both new and returning) with an introduction (or re-introduction) to Red Rocks Community College procedures, academic programs, and student services. Make sure your speakers are connected and your sound is turned on.

STEP 5: COMPLETE THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS

- Submit ACT or SAT scores or your high school transcript (See Chart below):

High School Exemptions:

College Level English	English 11 or 12	B or better in both semesters	3.0 GPA
MAT 120- Math for Liberal Arts	Algebra II or Geometry	B or better in both semesters	3.0 GPA
MAT 121- College Algebra	Pre-Calculus or Calculus	B or better in both semesters	3.0 GPA

*If your scores are equal or higher, you are eligible to take college level academic courses.

- OR** complete the free, Accuplacer Assessment. The Accuplacer measures your readiness for college level course work; it is not a test of whether or not you can attend Red Rocks, but a tool to help advisors place you in appropriate college courses.
