Red Rocks Community College (RRCC) is pleased to offer academic and career based high school classes for college credit that is taught in the high school classroom. Start your college transcript now- the credit earned is for dual enrollment – college credit which will be permanently recorded on your official college transcript and high school credit toward graduation requirements.

There is no cost to the student!

If you are enrolled in a class that is eliqible to receive RRCC credit, please follow the steps below to get started:

STEP 1: APPLY COMPLETE THE FREE RED ROCKS COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPLICATION ONLINE AT:

www.rrcc.edu/apply



You will need:

- Your Social Security Number
- Colorado Driver's License or ID for your parent
- Residency information from your parent or legal guardian
- Select the **Fall 2017** semester on your application
- Select "YES" to create the College Opportunity Fund Application on your behalf.

STEP 2: TEST COMPLETE ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT

<u>Some</u> Concurrent Enrollment courses require students to meet academic requirements before registering. (Please refer to the score requirements chart)

You can meet requirements in one of the following ways:

- Submit your qualifying ACT or SAT scores
- Submit a copy of your high school transcript if you meet high school exemptions
- Take the free Accuplacer Test at your high school (proctored by your counselor)
 - Testing takes approximately 90 minutes
 - You must complete the free Red Rocks Application before testing
 - A photo ID is required to test (high school ID's accepted)
 - Visit https://accuplacer.collegeboard.org/students/prepare-for-accuplacer for study guides and to download the free Accuplacer Study App
- You can also take the free Placement Test at Red Rocks Community College
 - You must complete the free Red Rocks Application before testing
 - A photo ID is required to test (high school ID's accepted)

STEP 3: 1 REGISTER
