Assessment Detail:

Participation

Because attention and preparation are essential for success in this class, classroom participation scores will be assessed based on completion of assignments and exercises, meaningful contribution during discussions, attendance, etc. Not all contributions are meaningful: Incorporate vocabulary, theory, health care issues in the news, and other course material into your discussion responses. Absences, failure to complete assignments on time, and lack of meaningful contribution will negatively affect participation grades. The instructor reserves the right dock points if (s)he feels participation is lacking on your part, and it is your job to inquire with the instructor if you have questions.

Exegesis - Research Presentation/Discussion

An *exegesis* is defined as "the critical explanation or analysis of a text" (American Heritage Dictionary, online). There are two parts to this assignment. Further instructions for both the paper and presentation are posted on the *Course Content* page, in the *Assignments* folder.

Locate one article from a <u>communication or healthcare journal</u> that relates to information learned in this class and analyze it. Create a 4-5 minute presentation on the article, and write 5 questions for the class discussion. You will sign up for a specific day to lead this discussion. The article you select should be clearly linked to the assigned reading/topic for the day you present.

Family & Social Support Paper:

Compose a 3-5 page (Double Spaced, 12 point font, Times New Roman) research paper on a topic related to supportive communication in areas of health and wellbeing. This paper is research oriented (i.e., Not based on personal experience).

Cite at least 4 sources in the paper (i.e., In-text citations), and include your sources on a (separate) reference page (NOT works cited or bibliography page) at the end of this paper. Your paper is required to be 3 (full) pages in length. Failing to reach this minimum requirement will result in a loss of 15 points (out of 50). Follow APA formatting instructions given in class.

Possible Topic Ideas/Examples -

- Children Caring for Parents (Cultural Perspectives)
- Eating Disorders & Family Communication
- Postpartum Depression
- Communicating Health Behaviors in The Family
- Mental Health & Close Relationships; Abuse & Finding Support
- Addiction (e.g., Alcoholism) Social Support

Media Images & Health Reflection Paper:

Compose a 2 to 3 (Double Spaced, 12 point font, Times New Roman) research paper on a topic related to media and images of health in contemporary society. This assignment may be based on your own personal experiences, and you are only required to cite our textbook. If you want to use additional sources, you are welcome to do so. Please make sure the paper is 2 (full) pages in length, at a minimum.

Possible Topic Ideas/Examples -

- Healthy Body Image (Female or Male)
- Nutrition Images in the Media (e.g., Diets; Supplements; Sugar)
- Health Crises Management & Media (e.g., CDC; FDA; FEMA Cases)
- Mental Health Depression/Bipolar/Abuse in Relationships/Addiction
- Smoking/Alcohol/Marijuana (Media) Campaigns
- Senior Citizens and Fitness
- Kids & Fitness in Schools
- Diabetes/Heart Disease/Arthritis Media Campaigns

Public Health Campaign Project:

The final project requests that you create and deliver a 7 to 10 minute presentation. The presentation should be an original public health campaign on any issue studied or examined in our course (e.g., Benefits of reducing sugar consumption). You will

need a visual aid (e.g., PowerPoint), as well as a promotional flyer or brochure (for the class). The rubric and instructions for this final assignment will be distributed in a separate handout during class. Elements of speech presentation (e.g., Verbal Delivery) will be evaluated in addition to the organization of your content, ideas, and thoughtful application of your topic. Due to time demands, I cannot accept any late presentations.

Quizzes:

There will be 5 quizzes, taken on D2L this semester. Quizzes will be multiple choice or true-false. All quizzes are timed (20 minutes), and make-up quizzes or extensions are not given under any circumstances. Initiate
