COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this course is to examine the variety of religious experience and expression that is found in the leading modern art form. This will be accomplished by examining films which have either/both an overtly religious subject matter, or a religious subtext in their style. The basic concepts, ethics and symbolism of religion systems will be applied to the study of film in order to show how film itself may serve as religious experience.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

This course is designed to acquaint the student with the technical and historical background necessary to examine the symbolic and metaphoric connection between film and religious expression; to expose students to religious and cultural expressions which may be unfamiliar; to open the students' film-going experience to the possibilities of a symbolic/religious dimension.
