## ASSET/DACA GETTING STARTED – CHECKLIST

### **Step One: Submit an Application**

- Start your journey at Red Rocks Community College by filling out the online application for admission at [www.rrcc.edu/apply](http://www.rrcc.edu/apply). Once you complete your application you will receive a Student ID number. Write your Student ID number here \_\_\_\_\_ and save this number as you will need it in the future for registration.
- Complete the Application for the College Opportunity Fund (COF) at [www.rrcc.edu/college-opportunity-fund](http://www.rrcc.edu/college-opportunity-fund). This stipend may pay a portion of your in-state tuition costs. Or when applying online select the option to “YES apply on my behalf” on the signature tab.
- Establish in state tuition by making an appointment with Janis Eagan in the Office of Admissions or Veronica Estrada in the Student Outreach and Retention Office. **Please note: you must have a copy of your High School Transcripts and photo ID ready.**

### **Step Two: Complete Red Rocks 101 Orientation (Online)**

Designed to help students successfully navigate the college experience, Red Rocks 101 covers important topics such as class registration, financial aid, degree and certificate options, and student services. ### **Step Three: Assessment Test & Previous Transcripts (if applicable)**

Colorado requires all students complete a math and language assessment before taking classes at any state school (unless you qualify for an exemption). The assessment is free and computerized, no appointment is necessary, and there's no such thing as failing (it just helps place you in the right classes). If you have taken any college coursework prior to starting classes at RRCC, please provide your transcripts, as they may exempt you from the assessment test or give you credit for prior learning. Please visit our Student Records web page for more information at [www.rrcc.edu/student-records](http://www.rrcc.edu/student-records). You can also be exempt from the assessment if you scored at or above the scores below on the ACT or SAT.

**ACT SCORES:** Reading: 17, English: 18, Math: 19. **SAT SCORES:** Reading: 800-830, English: 840-870, Math: 880-920

### **Step Four: Meet with an Academic Advisor/Register for classes**

Our experienced advisors will interpret your assessment results, and help pick the right classes for your chosen degree program. Have a question about which certificate or degree is right for you? ### **Step Five: Register for Classes**

You may register for classes in person at the Lakewood or Arvada campus or you can login to the student portal “The Rock” and register for classes online. Be sure to register for classes as early as possible before classes fill up, paying special attention to which campus each class is offered at.

- ✓ U.S. Citizens, Permanent Resident, DACA- benefitted, ASSET eligible students
- ✓ Planning to enroll and complete at least 6 credits at RRCC

#### Qualifications

- Scholarship Application
- Personal Statement of 500 words (2 pages)
- Transcript – Cumulative GPA of 2.0
