




Continuing on at RRCC?

 - Password reset tool: Need Help with your log in?





Associate of Arts (AA)


Built for transferability to 4year colleges and universities

Examples: Education business, fine arts, political science, counseling, communications, etc.

Associate of Science (AS)

Built for transferability to 4year colleges and universities

Examples: math, medicine, science, engineering, etc.



Associate of Applied Science (AAS)

Prepares students for entrylevel employment through a career-oriented program of study

Firefighting, HVAC, Graphic

Design, Culinary Arts, etc.



Common accommodations

- Extended Testing Time
- Distraction-Reduced Testing Area
- Materials/Books in Alternate Format
- Sign Language Interpreter
- Captioned Media
- Use of Assistive Technology
- Preferential Seating
- Access to lecture notes/presentations

Accommodations Process

- 1. Complete Student Information Form
- Upload Disability Information (IEP, 504, letter from provider)
- 2. Complete Rights and Responsibilities Agreement
- 4. Schedule an initial meeting


