

Finding An Internship

The RRCC Career Success Center Internship and Experiential Learning Office is here to assist you in finding an internship by providing resources and connections. The Internship and Experiential Learning Office is not a placement office and does not guarantee students internships. It is your responsibility to find an internship – but, we are here to help throughout the process.

Create or Update Your Resume

Employers looking for interns usually request a resume from applicants. The first step in the internship process is to create a resume or update your current resume to show the related skills and coursework you have for an internship.

RRCC Career Connect

Career Connect allows you to search and apply for internships 24/7 from organizations interested in RRCC students and alumni. Career Connect will provide you with information about each internship as well as specific instructions on how to apply. You already have access to Career Connect! Log in to **The Rock** and look for the **Career Connect** button on your **Welcome tab**. To view internships, click on **Update Profile** and **Edit Profile**. Under **Demographic Information** and **Desired Position** make sure to select **Internship** to be able to view all Internships.

Faculty Connections

Faculty in your area are great resources to help you find potential internships sites. Set-up an appointment with a faculty member to discuss your career goals and potential internship opportunities. You will also need an Instructor Recommendation Form before you start your internship so this meeting is a great time to discuss your internship and if your instructor is willing to provide a recommendation for an internship.

Career Services Experiential Learning Coordinator

The Experiential Learning Coordinator assists students in finding and obtaining internships. *Provide a list of 5-7 employers you would be interested in doing an internship for with their name, contact name within the organization, website, phone number, and email address for contact to the Experiential Learning Coordinator.* The Experiential Learning Coordinator will contact employers on your behalf to make an introduction and find out application instruction for internships. It is always the student's responsibility to follow-up on leads appropriately.
