## Red Rocks Community College Associate of Arts Degree with an Optional Plan of Study in Secondary Mathematics Education

The Associate of Arts Degree with an optional emphasis in secondary mathematics education is designed for the community college student who wishes to transfer to a four-year secondary mathematics education licensure program. Students who complete the program and concentration at Red Rocks Community College with a grade point average of 2.5 or better (with a grade of “C” or better in all mathematics coursework) will qualify for acceptance to the Regis University Secondary Mathematics Education program offered through the College of Professional Studies and may complete their baccalaureate program by completing just 51 additional credit hours.

The specific nature of the courses required for both the degree and optional emphasis are aligned with the basic knowledge and mathematics requirements specified by the Colorado Department of Education Mathematics Model Content Standards as well as state-required coursework for secondary licensed teachers. Upper-level coursework required for secondary mathematics licensure and baccalaureate completion may be completed at a four-year institution.
