## West Rail Line is Bike Friendly

The West Rail Line is pedestrian and bike friendly and will serve as a major conduit for cyclists and walkers for decades to come. New bike paths have been added in many places along the West Rail Line using a combination of new dedicated bike paths and bike lanes as well as public streets.

### The West Rail Line features many bike and pedestrian friendly amenities:

- New 10 foot wide bike paths
- More than 12 miles of new or improved bike paths or bike lanes
- Access to Denver’s Platte River Trail
- Bike and pedestrian bridges over Wadsworth Boulevard and Kipling Street
- Bicycle parking at bike racks or bike lockers at many stations along the West Rail Line
- Widened sidewalks along the newly constructed Federal and Sheridan bridges for added safety while walking or cycling

### Bikes on light rail

We welcome bikes on all of our light rail trains. Just wait by one of the bike loading symbols on the platform, and load your bike at any front or rear entrance (except behind the operator).

- When the train arrives, please allow other passengers to exit or board before loading your bike
- Stand against the wall and hold on to your bike during the ride
- Please remember there is a two bike maximum at each bike entrance

### Bikes on bus

RTD buses feature self-service bike racks on the front of each vehicle, except for the 16th Street FREE MallRide.

- To release the bike rack, squeeze the center handle and lower it down
- Place the front wheel on the side labeled front wheel
- Pull the support arm over the wheel closest to the fork
- When exiting remind the driver you are removing your bike
- Return the rack to its upright position
