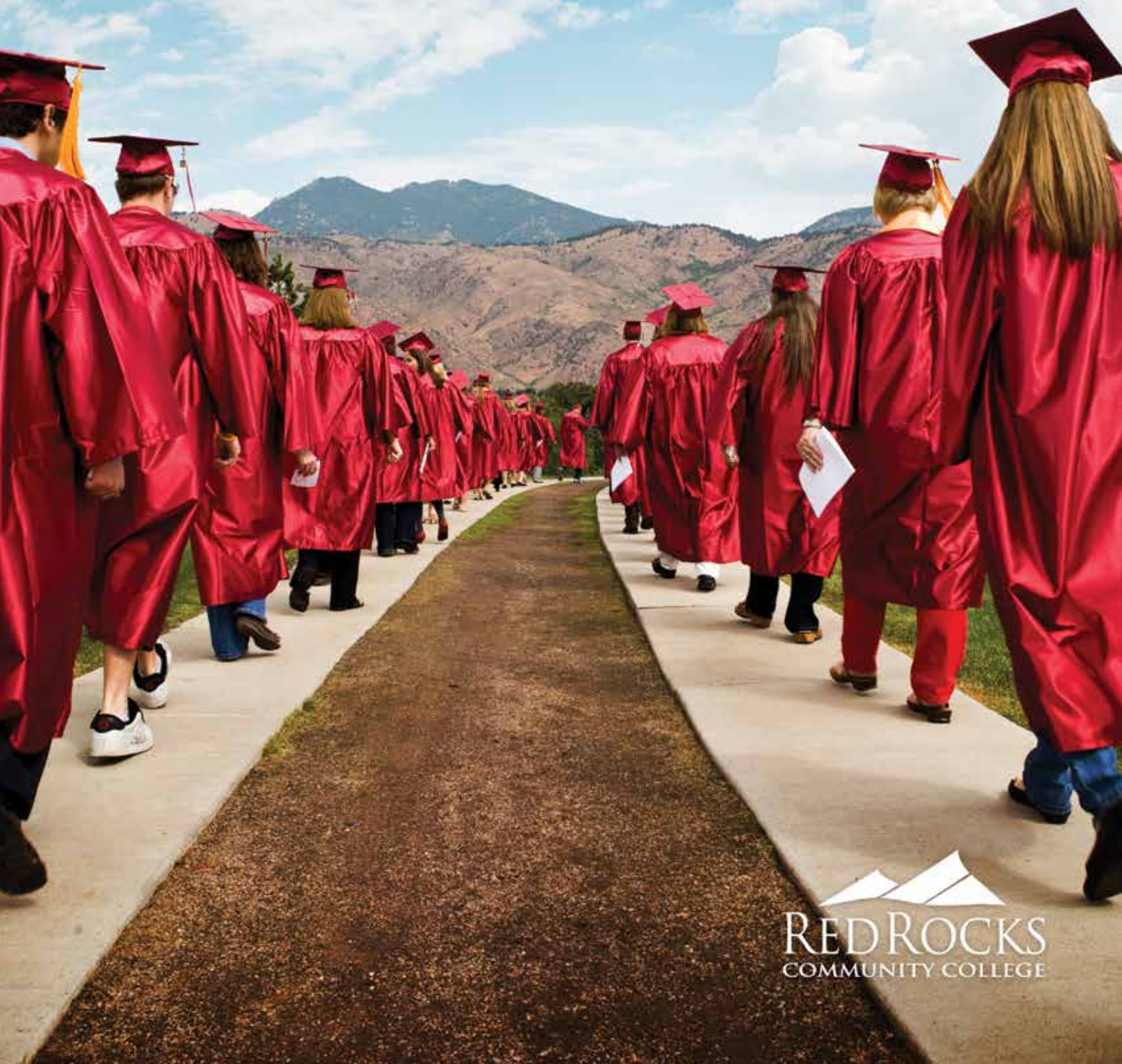

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENTS

Fall is always an exciting time as a new school year kicks off, but it is also a great time for reflection and in thinking about the past year both at Red Rocks Community College (RRCC) and the Foundation, growth, learning and achievement all come to mind. Among the exciting happenings at Red Rocks was the approval for the college to offer a master's degree in association with its Physician Assistant (PA) program. New national PA program accreditation standards will require training institutions to be able to confer an associated master's degree. Our historical partnership with St. Francis University to offer a master's option to enrolled students will no longer be acceptable. In order to secure our PA program, one of only two in the state and the only one focused on primary care and caring for underserved populations, legislative approval was sought and won for RRCC to be the conferring institution for a Master of Physician Assistant Science. With the first big hurdle behind us, we look forward to becoming the first community college in the nation to offer a master's degree! While that was certainly a big undertaking, it was by no means the only happening this past year.

In the following pages you will find student profiles that are testimony to the growth, learning and achievement that takes place each year. Each of the students featured in this year's annual report are Foundation scholarship recipients, members of RRCC's two-year honor society Phi Theta Kappa (PTK), and leaders at the college. Some of the students are also graduates of the Gateway program.

The Gateway program, another of RRCC's unique programs, was established in 2006 and is dedicated to helping individuals that have been involved in the justice system develop the skills and confidence necessary to successfully transition back into society. The only program of its kind in the state, 700+ students have graduated from Gateway and over half have continued their education at RRCC and beyond. You will learn more about one of the reasons Gateway has been so successful and other highlights of the 2012-2013 year as you read through the following report. And as you do, remember that you have helped make all the success possible and for that, we are deeply grateful.

Each year the Foundation provides need-based scholarships to students who have received an invitation to join Phi Theta Kappa (PTK), the 2-year college honor society. Students are invited to join PTK if they achieve an overall grade point average of 3.5 and complete at least 12 hours of college level courses at Red Rocks. The need-based scholarships from the Foundation help offset the cost of the one-time initiation fee, which can often be a barrier to joining for a student. Membership in PTK provides access to leadership opportunities as well as scholarships to Red Rocks and 4-year institutions in Colorado and around the country. One of those leadership projects during the past year was **the Rockstar Program.**

ROCKSTARS

The Rockstar Program was started by Phi Theta Kappa members as they attempted to develop an Honors in Action project in the Fall of 2012. The members were challenged with creating a project around the culture of competition within academic settings that would benefit the college. As 30 of us sat in a room and discussed how competition has affected each one of us, we realized that there was an opportunity to foster connection. We realized that while we all came from different walks of life and backgrounds, we still stood on common ground. We have each struggled to be successful students, successful wives, mothers, husbands, fathers, siblings, sons, daughters, and contributors to society.

We each were striving toward something far beyond obtaining a college degree, we are here because we are seeking change (whether we want to change the world or just change ourselves). We realized that competition is the driving force behind what has made us successful students, and that each one of us had found a variety of different on and off-campus resources to help us along the way. We also realized that there are so many students that are unaware of tools out there to help them succeed.

It is with those realizations that we decided to create something that would not only highlight our individual stories, but something that would unite us all. Rock Stars was born with a vision to provide mentorship, assistance, and pathways towards helping everyone succeed as a Red Rocks student. We found that competing in this world did not have to be a solo endeavor, and that people are able to achieve more when they have a support system to help them.

Laura Baldrige Johnson Financial Aid Scholarship

Laura returned to college once she was ready to embrace an education. It took a little while, but she realized that science has always been her path. She is majoring in Biology and can often be found in the Science hallway since she is busy as a teaching assistant in Bio 111 and a student taking courses. She has maintained a 4.0 GPA and will graduate fall 2013 with plans to transfer to finish a bachelor's degree and then onto graduate school.

"I will say that Red Rocks has been an amazing place to restart my journey. The staff is incredible, and more supportive than I could ever hope. I never feel like I am just a number here. It has also been a blessing to be an openly gay student, and not feel as though I am being bullied or discriminated against. Not having to carry that weight on my shoulders has helped me be so successful. I am very grateful for all that Red Rocks has given me. It will be a bittersweet graduation, but I'm ready for all the doors Red Rocks has helped open."



Rita Erickson Kingdom Enlightenment Scholarship

"Before I came to Red Rocks, I lead a troubled life. I had no direction and only cared about myself. The last time that I was arrested, I discovered that I was pregnant with my daughter Danika. I decided that I would change my life in order to raise her. The journey from my old life to my new life brought me to Red Rocks."

Rita came to Red Rocks through the Gateway program where she found a community of supportive teachers and friends who encouraged her to engage in positive change. It helped her transition into the Red Rocks community and gave her the foundation to succeed in college courses. She took advantage of the many resources students have at RRCC to help them reach their educational goals such as the Children's Day Care Center, Learning Commons, and Student Food Bank. She received scholarships through the RRCC Foundation which helped pay tuition along with her on-campus jobs to gain experience. She graduated with an Associate degree in Business Management in spring 2013 and has been accepted to Regis University to continue her education and finish her Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.

"It is my hope that my daughter Danika will never have to live the life I had to, and that she will follow in my footsteps and pursue an education to make her dreams come true."



Shaun Hollstrom Johnson Financial Aid Program Scholarship

Since high school Shaun has been working in construction, but decided he would do his body a favor and enroll in college to pursue a career. He just completed his fourth semester at Red Rocks and is working toward a degree in Water Quality Management. When he graduates next year, he plans to complete his bachelor's at Regis University. He is a math and chemistry tutor at RRCC and an active member of PTK.

"The major contributors to my success are my wife, tutoring, and the great instruction by the dedicated teachers and staff. Red Rocks is not only a place for learning, but has become a second home for me."



Robert White Daniel's Boundless Opportunity Scholarship

When asked what he would remember most about his time at Red Rocks, Robert White, 2013 Outstanding Graduate and Foundation Scholarship Recipient, shared three things, "The mesa, because of its peaceful vibe it brought to me every morning, The community atmosphere at the school and how it, along with the Foundation, made attending college friendly, hassle free, and affordable, and Michele Haney, RRCC President."

Five years ago, Robert had an eighth grade education and was serving a four year sentence in community corrections. In 2009 he got his GED and a year later started at RRCC working toward a degree. Today, he has an associate degree from Red Rocks Community College. Soon he will have a bachelor's degree from Colorado State University where he is studying computer science. He intends to continue onto a master's degree and ultimately plans to earn a doctorate from the Colorado School of Mines.

While at Red Rocks Community College he maintained a 3.8 GPA, was a member of Phi Theta Kappa, President of the R.O.C.K. Club two years in a row- the R.O.C.K. Club is the Red Rocks Outreach Community Club on campus whose members work to give back to the community through volunteerism, and a graduate of the Gateway program.



The Foundation partnered with the Gateway program and the Theater department to produce a metro Denver tour of Scars: Breaking the Cycle. Since 2006, RRCC's Theatre Department has partnered with the Gateway program to bring the words of Gateway students to life. Beginning with a one night open stage reading in the student hall, the program and the audiences grew, demanding a more developed production. In 2009 and again in 2011 main stage productions of Scars were performed at Red Rocks. In 2013, the production took to the road and spread the message of hope and transformation to nine metro Denver venues reaching nearly 800 youth and adult audience members.

SCARS: *BREAKING THE CYCLE*

The Gateway program works with ex-offenders to help them develop the skills and confidence necessary to successfully transition back into society. More than 700 students have completed the Gateway program, 65% of whom have continued their education at RRCC. The Gateway program has maintained less than a 5% rate of recidivism among their participants since its inception in 2006. As part of the Gateway program, students write essays that reflect on life choices and accept responsibility for their future. Their essays respond to the question, "What is your scar? An everlasting mark to remind you that something important happened." The result is a collection of Scar Papers that tell the story of family dysfunction, past regrets, struggles with addiction, incarceration, and a long challenging path to healing.

Scars: Breaking the Cycle is the artistic development of Gateway student essays adapted into a script, performed by an ensemble cast, and realized to a full theatrical production. The script is created by editing the papers, abstracting the ideas written, and developing scene work from the original narrative. All Scars performances include a talkback session directly after the performance. This talkback session gives the audience an opportunity to engage the artists and question or comment on what they have just experienced. This unique process provides the audience with an emotional outlet and an opportunity to shape their understanding of the challenges facing this segment of society.

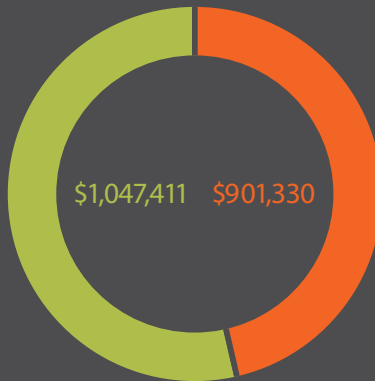
