Seidel Moses Enrollment Management Updates:

Noel Levitz coming to campus February 22nd, for the entire day. They are visiting all CCCS schools to assess barriers to the application, registration, and aid processes.

Strategic Enrollment developed 5 deliverable Goals for Summer/Fall registration cycle:

1. Workforce Development

over 3 years our numbers have gone from 1,000 to 60 to 0 We used to have a position where RRCC paid half and the Workforce paid half

2. Texting Students

RRCC Administration wants to wait on this

3. Leverage Social Media

Develop Facebook Pathway communities Create cohort connections Look at best practices from around the country

4. Stop the Drop

Faculty & Instructors add a blurb into their syllabi directing students to talk with someone before they drop a class. Different kinds of students drop: Those who drop everything and walk away Students who drop some classes, but are still in other classes Students who are dropped for non-attendance

Student pad their schedules for cancelled class protection, not liking instructors, etc.

Change messaging about drops Create Academic course maps, giving lessor limited options for enrollment Largest CRN for dropping is MAT 120 and another MAT Create message not to be afraid of Math Math Monster t shirts

AT CCA:

Inclusive excellence training for all Math instructors in classroom: language used, syllabus, connect with AAA course. All language assumes success.

We have lots of adjunct instructors, how are we consistently on-boarding students for success?

If students are connected with clubs, or a cohort, 80% retention

5. Rethink Admissions/Recruiting

Open to hearing suggestions for how to better serve students

Become more active/less passive...we need to go get students more intentionally

Call all new students to get them on to campus to register

Redesign positions to be Navigators which are Admission Counselors with addition of smaller processing job

Assigned caseload of students from admins to census

Have students connecting to a Navigator for their life at RRCC

Example: Malone had a student body of 2,200, yet had 13 Admission Counselors CCD made changes and added recruiters Caseload management model is the goal Increase CHAT function usage Remove big front desk as barrier, make it more inviting
