Raising an Emotionally Intelligent Child

#### **Emotional Intelligence is:**

"The ability to monitor one's own and others' feelings, to discriminate among them and to use this information to guide one's thinking and actions".

# Why is Emotional Intelligence Important?

Emotion functions to help a child adapt within the environment. It provides the child with important information and prepares the child for action. Emotion is essential in communicating with others. Children learn to manage emotion in a way that helps them adapt.

#### <u>Components of Emotional</u> <u>Intelligence:</u>

- Self-awareness: Ability to understand and be aware of one's feelings and moods
  - Develop a feeling vocabulary
  - Label children's feelings
- 2. **Managing Emotions:** Ability to display emotions in socially appropriate ways

- Teach children strategies for dealing with strong emotions
- Help children to understand that feelings change
- 3. **Empathy:** Ability to understand how others feel
  - Teach child to link actions with emotions
  - Empathize with your child
  - Suggest ways your child can show empathy
  - Instead of making a child apologize have the child focus on what the other child is feeling
- 4. **Social skills:** Ability to deal with others' emotions
  - Teach child that people express feelings in different ways
  - Teach child that feelings differ from person to person

#### When Talking to Your Child About **Strong Emotions:**

- Normalize your child's feelings
- Do not minimize your child's
- the child's emotion, not necessarily their behavior
- Avoid "hanging out to dry"
