The Anti War Movement in the United States During World War

Emma Goldman was an anarchist and labor organizer known for her political

activism, writing and speeches. In 1917, Goldman and a companion were

ntenced to two years in jail for conspiring to "induce persons not to

register" for the newly instated draft. After their release from prison, they

were deported - along with hundreds of others - to the Soviet Union

Eugene Debs was an activist who worked in the labor movement in

the early 1900s, traveling around the nation giving talks to workers,

etc. In his outspoken views he suggested that wars are fought for

the rich at the expense of the poor. His resistance to WWI ended

with imprisonment under the Sedition and Espionage Act.

Michael Kazin's important history of American pacifism is
