October 1st - Tuition is always due on the first of every month, even on weekends.

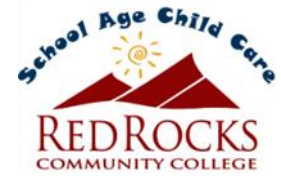

Our **BODIES** are safe

Our **FEELINGS** are safe

Our **BELONGINGS** are safe

STAFF are safe people to talk to.

Specific behavior concerns can include:

Threatening other children

Being physically aggressive

Disregarding staff direction

As we desire to help all children learn and grow, we will do our best to work with you, the parent, in a respectful manner through communication and problem solving. We hold the same standards for our parents, guardians, and staff as well. Disrespectful language, behavior or aggression will not be condoned or tolerated on site. In the children safe.
