Parent Resource Center: Making the Most of Bed Time Chats

Bedtime tuck-in can often be the perfect setting for engaging your kids in thoughtful conversation of the dreamy variety. The comfort and security of bedtime routines allow kids to open up and share from their heart.

To use this special time with your child for exploring dreams, aspirations, and bucket list goals together, try mulling over one of these questions before you kiss them goodnight:

- If you had a whole day free to do whatever you want, what would you choose to do?
- Who is your hero? Name one person you would like to be like. Can you tell me why you chose that person?
- What do you look forward to being able to do when you get a little older?
- Where would you most like to go on vacation? What would you want to do there? See there?
- Name something you would like to learn to do or spend time getting better at.
- What do people most look up to you for? Or what do you hope one day people will admire about you?

After your conversation, make a note of what stood out in your child's answers. Consider how you could help make those dreams come true.

Incorporating this exercise into your child's bedtime routine from time to time will take your parent-child bonding to a new level. Plus you'll have a whole new group of ideas for wake time activities you can pursue together.
