RRCC SACC 3 Safes

Our expectation for all the children in our care is that they follow the 3 Safes:

- Safe Bodies we do not harm ourselves or others. This means keeping our hands and bodies to ourselves.
- Safe Emotions we do not do or say anything that hurts other people's feelings. This includes using appropriate language and kind words.
- Safe Belongings We take good care of the materials around us whether they belong to a peer or the Red Rocks programs. This includes not throwing things inside, not breaking or damaging furniture or toys.
- Safe to Tell- If a child feels threatened or in danger at any time, they are encouraged to tell RRCC Staff or any adult they feel safe with. RRCC SACC is a safe place for all. We never want a child to feel unsafe or uncomfortable in our program.

Please help us reinforce these with your children. If needed, we will ask parents to join us for a conference if their child is struggling with these expectations.

Parent Resource Center: Kids & Technology

"While it may be natural to seek for your kid a childhood reminiscent of your own, our society is evolving, and childhood with it. Rapidly advancing technology and a changing environment will result in a different experience for those who are kids now and those who will be soon."

Technology as a social and professional life skill - the urge to shun tech for the youth out of a distrust or concern for it threatens a social and vocational handicap. Social networking site usage is only increasing, and computer engineering is projected to be one of the highest grossing college majors of 2017. An ignorance and unfamiliarity with technology will be a disadvantage.

Limiting Internet Time - all things should be taken in moderation and the Internet is no exception. Caution in the amount of time one spends online is reasonable and recommended – Internet addiction is a legitimate condition, and too much time spent in front of a screen can disrupt sleep schedules.

Internet Safety - Net safety is an important topic for children. It is important for parents to monitor how their children spend time online, and discuss the importance of protecting personal information, not talking to strangers, and not making in-app game purchases.

RRCC SACC Technology Guídelínes

It is our goal at Red Rocks to encourage the responsible use of technology by the children in our program.

- Personal devices for the purpose of doing homework are allowed Monday-Friday. Children are also able to use the school's computers during library time for homework or math and reasoning games, i.e. Cool Math Games & Prodigy.
- Personal devices for leisure activities such as games are allowed only on Fridays.
- "Appropriate content" is determined for each child based on the individual rules and guidelines established by their parents. Because these guidelines differ between families and individual children, personal devices cannot be shared between children in the program unless the content being shared is rated G or E for Everyone.
- Children are responsible for any personal device that they are allowed to bring to Red Rocks.
