Community Partners

Child Care Innovations partners with local community partners in counties across Colorado and continues to expand to support partnerships with local community agencies and Early Childhood Councils. The opportunity for each county to identify their community needs and resources has helped build an equipped Early Childhood Workforce.

Local Workforce Centers: This partnership has allowed early childhood professionals and those looking to enter the workforce to gain funding and access to enhance their skills and training in Early Childhood Education. The resources have proved valuable as we work to professionalize the early childhood industry and continue to work towards quality staff.

Community Colleges across the state have also worked in partnership with the Child Care Development Specialist Apprenticeship to gain access to scholarships and coursework to further traditional education for teachers looking to pursue higher education and certificate programs.
