

Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA)

The Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 is a civil rights law that ensures equal opportunity for people with disabilities. It prohibits discrimination based on disability in employment, transportation, telecommunication services, places of public accommodations, and services rendered by state and local governments.

A disability is defined by the ADAAA as: "With respect to an individual, a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities of such individual such as seeing, hearing, speaking, walking, breathing, performing manual tasks, learning, caring for oneself, and working."
