Articulation Agreement Red Rocks Community College and

University of Alaska Fairbanks Homeland Security and Emergency Management

This articulation agreement between **Red Rocks Community College** and the **University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF)** is intended to facilitate the transfer of credit between the institutions for students in the below-listed degree programs at Red Rocks Community College, who plan to complete UAF's Bachelor of Security and Emergency Management (BSEM) in Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM). This agreement encompasses the following degree programs:

- Associate of Applied Science in Cyber Security
- Associate of Applied Science in Emergency Management and Planning
- Associate of Applied Science in Emergency Medical Technology
- Associate of Applied Science in Paramedicine
- Associate of Applied Science in Fire Science Technology
- Associate of Applied Science in Fire Service Management
- Associate of Applied Science in Fire and Emergency Services
- Associate of Applied Science in Law Enforcement

Transfer Agreement Details

- University of Alaska regulations authorize UAF to accept credits in transfer for courses at the 100-level or above, with grades of C- or better, from regionally accredited institutions.
- Students will enter UAF with junior standing as long as they have completed 60 college-level credits with a grade of C or higher (remedial courses are not included in this standing).
- Up to 33 Red Rocks Community College credits can be used to meet the BSEM degree program's lower-division required emergency services or other approved subject area credits.
- Regardless of total number of credits transferred from Red Rocks Community College all degree requirements for the BSEM program must be met and at least 30 semester credits must be completed at UAF.

- Admission to UAF's BSEM will require a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or greater and satisfaction of all other conditions of admission as stated in UAF's catalog and at http://uaf.edu/admissions/apply.

- Both Red Rocks Community College and UAF agree to notify each other of changes to accreditation status or curriculum.
